**The Parish Council's budget:** At the end of March 2014 the Parish Council will have reserves of about £8000. Present spending is about £5000 a year and income is about £6000 a year. At its January meeting the Parish Council discussed whether its annual precept should be cut from the present level of £5800 in order to limit the build-up of reserves. The level of reserves is a matter for the Parish Council but good practice suggests that the Council holds at least half of its normal annual expenditure to meet any emergencies. The Parish Council can also hold reserves against anticipated expenditures of a one-off nature. The Parish Council decided to make no change in its precept. As a result, on the basis of its budget for 2014/15, the Parish Council will have reserves of about £9000 at the end of March 2015.

The dilemma the Parish Council faces is that though its reserves are high in relation to expected annual expenditure, they are modest in comparison to the cost of most projects that the Council could consider undertaking. For instance, four traffic speed indicator devices, two at each end of the village, would cost at least £10,000.

The Parish Council therefore decided to use the **Annual Parish Meeting, to be held on 21 May**, to have an open discussion on what projects it should pursue. We hope that you will attend and contribute to the discussion.

**Generator for the Community Hall:** The Parish Council agreed in principle to meet the costs of installing an external socket and necessary internal re-wiring at the Community Hall so that in the event of a prolonged power cut the hall would be available as an emergency centre. However, the Parish Council



has not agreed to provide or contribute to the costs of a generator. The acquisition of a generator, which may involve substantial costs, needs to be the subject of discussion involving the Hall Management Committee, the Parish Council and residents who in one way or another will bear the costs.

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## Volunteer Car Scheme

The Parish Council would like to introduce a volunteer car scheme on a trial basis. The scheme would provide lifts for non-emergency visits to doctors' surgeries in Broad Oak, Northiam and Rye and to hospitals in Rye, Hastings and possibly Eastbourne.

We envisage a straight forward scheme. A person seeking a lift would phone one of the volunteers to see if he or she was available at the time requested. If the first volunteer called was not available another volunteer on the list would be approached until one was able to meet the request. It would be for the volunteer driver to decide if they wished to receive a payment to cover petrol costs. If so the cost would be 20p per mile (about £4 to and from the Conquest Hospital) which the driver would recover from the Parish Council.

### What would being a volunteer involve?

1. Your name and telephone number would be on a list placed on the Parish Council website, included in the newsletter and displayed in local surgeries.
2. On receiving a request you would decide if it is convenient to offer a lift. You would not be expected to re-arrange your plans to meet the request. The intention is that the list of volunteers is sufficiently long so that a driver available at the required time would be found.
3. You decide if you want to recover the costs from the Parish Council.
4. There would be no vetting of drivers for their skills.
5. It would be for you to decide whether to inform your insurance company that you had joined the scheme. (This is advisable, and unlikely to involve any additional premium).
6. At any time and without prior notice you could ask for your name to be taken off the list.



If you would like to volunteer please contact our clerk, or any councillor. With sufficient volunteers we can get the scheme up and running soon and join the other 50 or so community volunteer transport schemes in East Sussex.
